Various different styles are in use

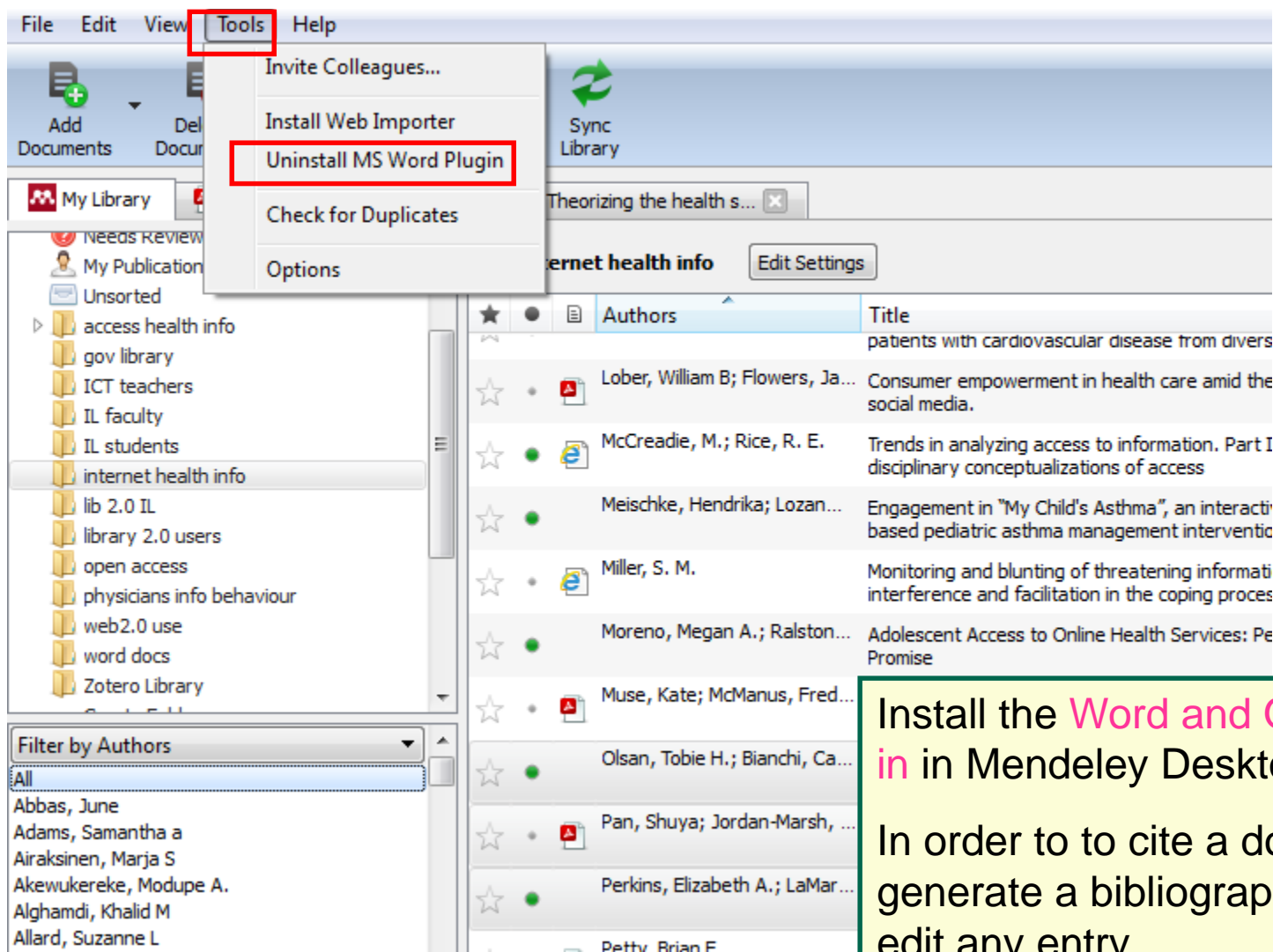
If you are writing a paper for an academic journal, use the style that they specify

If no advice, choose one of the Institution's recommended schemes: Harvard, Numeric (Like Vancouver)

Vancouver probably is the most suitable one for Health & Medical subjects

Mendeley supports **over 1180 citation styles**

# Installing the Word plug-in

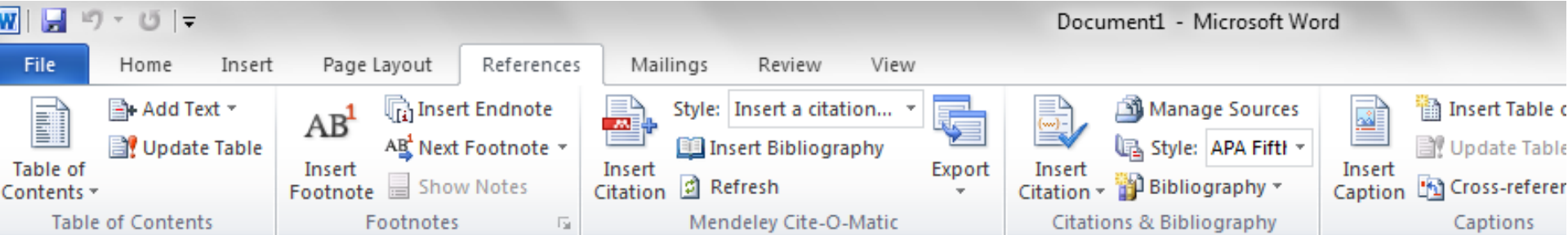


Install the **Word and OpenOffice plug-in** in Mendeley Desktop

In order to to cite a document, generate a bibliography, or manually edit any entry.

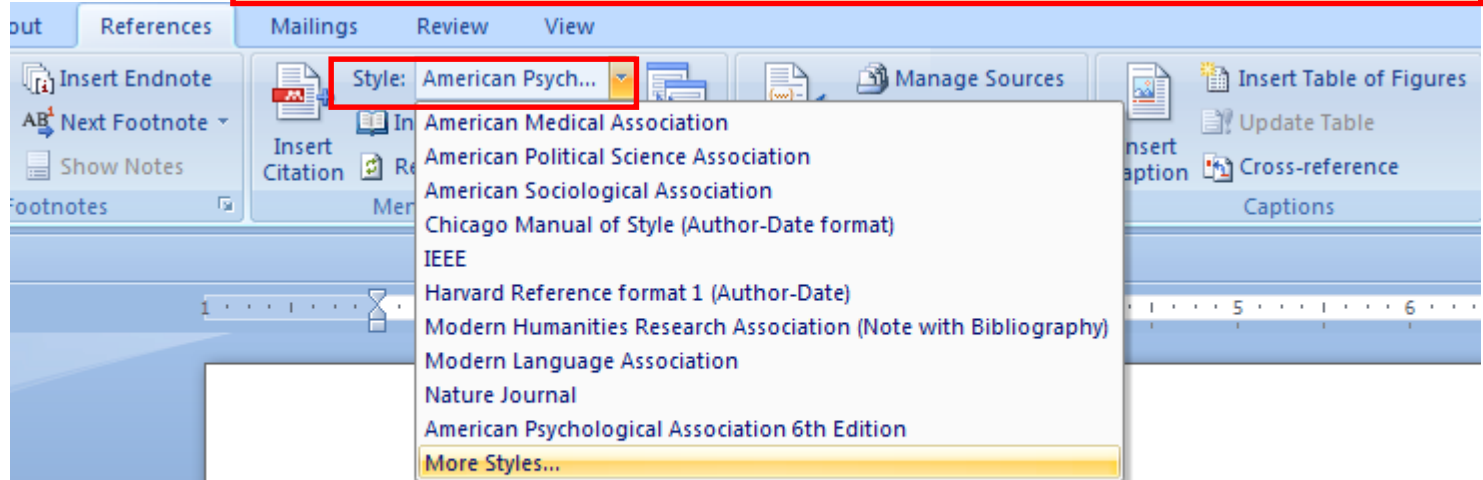
Go to **Tools – Install MS Word Plugin**.

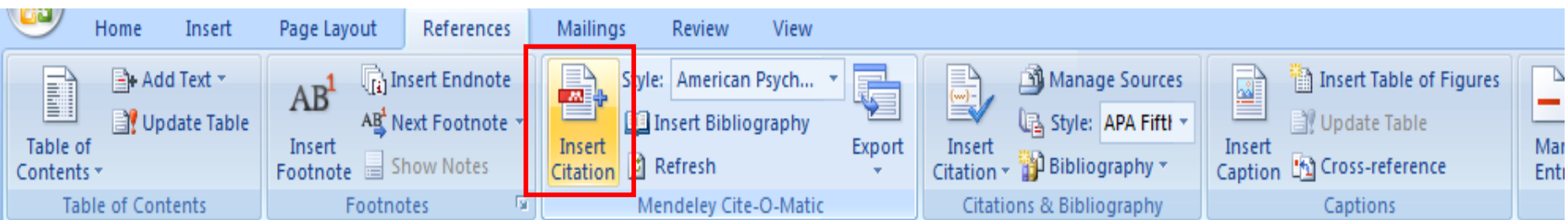
# Using the Word plug-in – Cite while writing



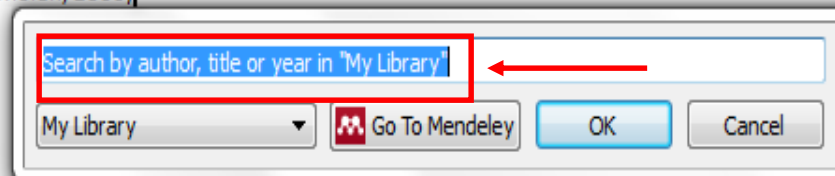
Once installed you will have **tool bar buttons** that will allow you to cite a document, generate a bibliography, or manually edit any entry. This will save you time and effort when you write.

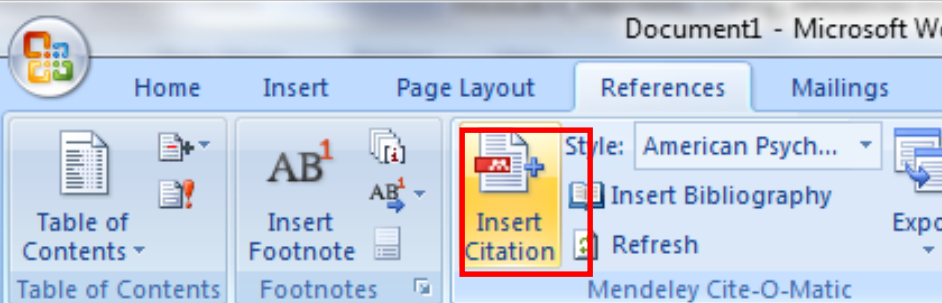

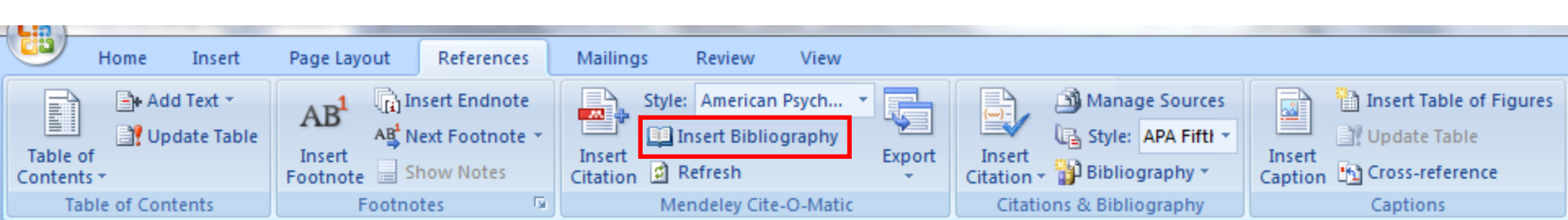

## METHODS AND FINDINGS:

Members and collaborators of the Malaria and the MARCH Centers, at the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine, were contacted and protocols reviewed for East African studies that measured (1) birth weight, (2) gestational age at birth using antenatal ultrasound or neonatal and (3) neonatal mortality. Ten datasets were identified and four met the inclusion criteria. Four datasets (from Uganda, Kenya, and two from Tanzania) contained 5,727 births between 1999-2010. 4,843 births had complete outcome data and were included in an participant level meta-analysis. 99% of 445 low birth weight (<2,500 g) babies were born (<37 weeks gestation) or small for gestational age (below tenth percentile of gestational age). 52% of 87 neonatal deaths occurred in preterm or small for (Van Der van Deursen, 2012) gestational age babies. Babies born <34 weeks gestation had the highest risk of death compared to term babies (odds ratio [OR] 58.7 [95% CI 28.4-121.4]), with no significant difference when stratified by weight for gestational age. Babies born 34-36 weeks gestation with appropriate weight for gestational age had just three times the likelihood of neonatal death compared to babies born term, (OR 3.2 [95% CI 1.0-10.7]), (Ezeani, 2011; Wagner, Hu, & Hibbard, 2001)

# Exercise 1
